



Israeli Hostilities on Lebanon

SITUATION REPORT #15

SITUATION OVERVIEW


- During the past twenty-four hours, **61** airstrikes were recorded in various areas of Lebanon, mostly concentrated in the South, the Southern Suburbs of Beirut, and Bekaa, bringing the total number of attacks since the beginning of the aggression to **9,531**.
- The Lebanese Ministry of Health issued the toll of martyrs and wounded during the past twenty-four hours, where **28** martyrs and **113** wounded were recorded, bringing the total number since the start of the aggression to **2,169** martyrs and **10,212** wounded.
- To date, **1,023** IDP centers have been opened, with **822** centers reaching their maximum capacity.
- To date, **186,400** IDPs (38,700 families) have been registered in the shelters listed in the regulations issued by the National Operations Room.
- The **National Committee for the Coordination of Crisis Response Operations** is working with all relevant ministries to secure additional shelters in various governorates to receive the displaced.
- **Security agencies** are maintaining security, contributing to assisting the displaced, distributing food and fuel, protecting shelters, preventing monopolies, controlling prices, and monitoring and controlling borders.
- From September 23 to October 10, 2024, General Security recorded the crossing of **314,481** Syrian citizens and **111,801** Lebanese citizens into Syrian territory.
- The government's emergency committee receives international aid and distributes it to displaced people within a clear and transparent mechanism across governorates.
- The **European Union** is mobilizing all available emergency response tools to support those affected by the ongoing crisis in Lebanon, launching a three-flight humanitarian airlift operation, with the first flight to arrive in Beirut on 11 October. The flights will transport supplies from the European Union, including supplies for shelters.
- Through the EU's Civil Protection Mechanism, aid from **Spain, Slovakia, Poland, France, and Belgium** has been delivered to Beirut since last week, additional aid will be transferred from Greece in the coming days.
- The Canadian Department for International Development (DFID) announced that Canada will provide additional funding of CAD \$15 million to meet the urgent humanitarian needs of civilians in Lebanon.
- The French Ministry of Foreign Affairs announced that the international conference dedicated to Lebanon will be held in Paris on October 24th with the aim of mobilizing the international community to support the Lebanese and their institutions.


FREQUENCY OF ATTACKS ON LEBANON IN THE PAST 24 HOURS







MOVEMENT OF INTERNAL DISPLACEMENT

The number of IDPs registered in shelters identified by the National Operations Room has reached **186,400** IDPs so far, according to the National Platform.







NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS & RESPONSE PLAN

At the early beginnings of the aggressions, the Lebanese Government through the National DRR Committee to Coordinate Preparedness and Response, in accordance with the National Response Framework, identified the key focus areas of its national preparedness and response plan. This plan aims to mitigate the impact of hostilities in South Lebanon and establish preparedness measure based on potential scenarios.



National DRR Committee to Coordinate Preparedness and Response (Decision no.43/2024)

Monitor and evaluate the situation based on information from all sectors and Governorates and decide the level of response of the Government

Coordinate and follow-up the national response with the sectors

Collect and compile information and preparedness plans within the sectors in coordination with line ministries

Coordinate and liaise with all UN agencies on preparedness and response plans


GOVERNMENT RESPONSE PROCEDURES (IN 24 HOURS)

Civil Defense



• During the past 24 hours, the Civil Defense carried out 177 missions, including 12 missions to extinguish fires resulting from the Israeli aggression, two missions to remove rubble and search for missing persons, 21 missions to transport the wounded, 12 missions to recover and transport the bodies of martyrs, and 72 missions to transport water to shelters for the displaced.

Lebanese Red Cross:





- Distribution of aid to shelters included the distribution of 13,135 ready-to-eat meals, 1,234 blankets, 1,286 mattresses, 960 food parcels,
 819 hygiene kits, 2,123 water bottles, 2,430 bread bands, 18 dignity kits, and 4 kitchen sets.
- The Red Cross sent 88 volunteers to operations rooms in governorates, districts, ministries, and the central operations room to provide support and assistance in the response operations.
- In the past 24 hours, the Red Cross has provided 46 units of blood to hospitals in Beirut, Bekaa, South, and North.
- The Red Cross provided 745 medical consultations, 814 medical services, and 395 individual physiological first aid sessions.

INTERNATIONAL AID

The government's emergency committee is responsible for receiving international aid and distributing it to the displaced within a clear and transparent mechanism through the governors. Based on the information issued by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation, international donors and countries take the initiative to send in-kind assistance to Lebanon to contribute to the relief of victims and displaced in shelters by sending planes loaded with various medical and humanitarian aid to Rafic Hariri International Airport:

INTERNATIONAL COORDINATION AND SUPPORT
